Governors News

Welcome to the first governor update of the new academic year.

I had the pleasure of attending the school open day for prospective new students a couple of weeks ago. For the first time, it was held on a Saturday and was a resounding success. It was wonderful to see such enthusiastic staff and students showing our school off and the positive learning environment that has been created. I received many messages from parents saying how impressed they were with the school and that their children were adamant they wanted to come to Sherburn more than any other option available. Many thanks to everyone involved.

In so far as governors are concerned, we will be spending this half term looking in detail at the fantastic GCSE and A level results from this summer. Overall they are the best ever and especially the A level results which were fabulous. We will look **in detail at how individual departments and groups of students performed which will then help us decide where governor's efforts should be focussed over the coming year.** Great credit to all our staff and students for the huge amount of work involved in achieving such wonderful results.

Our other main focus this year is on the continued discussions about academisation and the prospect of forming the STAR Multi Academy Trust. It is likely that formal consultation will commence about this in the next few months and so as governors we are debating this issue at length to make sure decisions are the right ones for the young people of our area. I will keep you updated on this as our discussions progress.

Over the summer we have also seen the opening of the fabulous new 3G pitch which is now being used by our students and many other local groups in the evenings. It is great to see the facilities which have been provided after many years of campaigning and hard work (special thanks to our Local Authority governor rep, Bob Packham who has taken the lead on this for the school) and along with the new changing room facilities, the school is looking like it may be joining the 21st century, at least in some places. Watch this space as the working group continues to meet to try and progress other potential improvements.

Finally, I would like to thank Tracy Perrin our chair of finance and Jill Pounder our business manager who have done a wonderful job in very difficult circumstances, to keep our school finances in order. Money is very short for all schools and in particular for our school given its relatively small size, but they do a brilliant job at keeping us on track. Running the school finances is a very important part of the work of the Governing Body and we will continue to work on this over the coming year.



Where science and art collide!

What a start it has been to the term, the Big Bang Club was relaunched in the middle of September and is open to all Year 7 and 8 pupils. We have been carrying out a lot of exciting experiments, starting off with fire writing, where members produced some fantastic designs along with rather a lot of smoke!



Descent of the Ardèche

July saw the return of the annual Sherburn High descent of the Ardèche in the Rhone Alps region of Southern France. This year was the turn of our Sixth Form students to try their hand at the river based adventure holiday. It was a trip of mixed emotions - we were able to welcome with excitement, a large number of Year 11 students, who had decided to stay on at Sherburn High, they were able to get to know their new sixth form companions a little better. However, it was also a time to say goodbye to some of our Year 13 students who were tackling the Deche for a third time.

It was an excellent trip and once again, we were blessed with gorgeous summer weather in "The Grand Canyon" of Europe. Acorn staff were excellent, enabling our students to challenge themselves more than they had before by letting them decide the best route through the tricky rapids on our navigation down the river. For the first time, Sherburn High students were able to visit a secret underwater cave as part of their descent. The night in between the two-day descent was spent under the mostly clearest of skies where we saw a huge number of shooting stars lighting up the sky - a perfect way to relax after the exhausting run/jog/walk/crawl up to the top of a breath taking viewpoint, overlooking the beautiful limestone gorge.

It wasn't just the descent which provided students with extra challenge, there were also blindfolded attempts up Jacob's Ladder and blindfolded leaps of faith over the edge of a 12 metre platform. We had an excellent day spent relaxing on the beach at Valon Pont D'Arc, where we were able to swim, sunbathe and attempt some big rock jumps into the river below.

We were treated superbly by the Acorn staff who couldn't have done more to make the trip an enjoyable and unforgettable experience. We are delighted to welcome so many of the Year 11s back to the sixth form and hope the Year 13s have an excellent time at university.

Now, it's time to start getting ready for the descent of the Deche in 2018, where almost ninety Year 9 and 10 students will be getting ready to tackle the challenge ahead.

I can now reveal that we are beginning to plan the Ardeche trip in 2019, where all current students in Year 12 will be invited to relax and enjoy the "trip of a lifetime". Students in Year 11 will also be invited along on the trip when they stay on in our Sixth Form.



We are well into the new school term. I am proud to say Bramham students have settled back into school life with an outstanding attitude to learning and the atmosphere across the house is extremely positive.


