This year, we want to help as many families as we can enjoy Christmas, so... What is the appeal?



- The appeal is to help those who are affected by poverty, but in particular, children at Christmastime.
- We would like to ask for your help to support a local charity called The Clothing Bank, based not far from Sherburn in Knottingley.
- The Clothing Bank is working really hard to provide help to children in need this Christmas so that they get a present and some new pyjamas.
- There is a massive need this year because as well as those they would usually help, there are so many more families who need help because of Covid-19 which has meant people have lost their jobs, are working less hours, getting less money or sadly family members have died.

How does it work?

Donate a pair of pyjamas.



- You probably get a pair of new Christmas pyjamas yourself, and this adds to the excitement of Christmas, making you feel happy.
- The families we want to help won't be able to afford to do this.
- The Clothing Bank wants to be able to give this feeling to as many families as possible and need all sizes of pyjamas from toddlers to teenagers.
- If you can, please could you buy a pair of pyjamas in a size from age 2-16
- Wrap them up in Christmas wrapping paper and put a note on saying e.g. girl's/boy's pyjamas age 3-4
- We really want to get as many as possible and for Team Sherburn to make a difference to our local community.

Or if you would rather buy a present?




- So many of these families are not able to give gifts as they will just not have the money and a lot is due to the impact of Covid 19 and lockdown restrictions.
- We can help make Christmastime a bit happier for these families and hopefully give them something they will love and will make them happy.

If this is what you would like to do:

- Choose either a boy or a girl aged 2-16
- Wrap the present in Christmas paper
- Write on a note what's inside e.g. pencil case and colouring pencils and stick to the parcel
- The Clothing Bank has given us some ideas: socks, pants, tights, hats, scarves, gloves/mittens, pens, activity book, notepads. I am sure you will have so many more ideas too. (No food items please)

- A little gesture has a big impact
