ENGLISH

Key Stage 2 Curriculum includes:

Reading aloud a wide range of books and poetry with accuracy; be able to summarise and present a similar story of their own; read most words effortlessly; good understanding, inferring meanings of unfamiliar words; grammar and punctuation should be broadly accurate; Pupil's reading a writing should be sufficiently fluent and effortless for them to manage the demands of KS3 curriculum.

When writing continue to distinguish between homophones,; use a dictionary and thesaurus; write legibly, fluently with increasing speed; plan writing identifying audience and purpose; narrative writing should consider characters and setting; draft and write using longer passages and a wide range of devices to build cohesion across paragraphs; ensuring that subject verb agreement is appropriate; edit own and other's writing; proofread for spelling and punctuation errors; write using passive and active voice; modal verbs and adverbs for degree of possibility; commas an hyphens to avoid ambiguity.
